Reminder letters will incur a charge of £40 +VAT:
 - the Annual Governance and Accountability Return Sections 1 and 2, together with
 - a bank reconciliation as at 31 March 2025
 - an explanation of any significant year on year variances in the accounting statements
 - notification of the commencement date of the period for the exercise of public rights
 - Annual Internal Audit Report 2024/25

Unless requested, do not send any additional documents to your external auditor. Your external auditor will ask for any additional documents needed.

Once the external auditor has completed the limited assurance review and is able to give an opinion, the Annual Governance and Accountability **Section 1, Section 2 and Section 3 – External Auditor Report and Certificate** will be returned to the authority by email or post.

Publication Requirements

Under the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015, authorities must publish the following information on the authority website/webpage:

Guidance notes on completing Form 3 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) 2024/25

With reference to Section 1, Annual Governance Statement 2024/25:

- **Box 2** – A 'No' response has been recorded, as the council did not consistently present quarterly reports comparing actual income and expenditure to the approved budget throughout the financial year. While budget monitoring was carried out and overall expenditure remained within the approved limits, the formal reporting schedule was not fully adhered to. In particular, the quarterly financial report for the July meeting was delayed due to a commitment to transparency and the intention to work collaboratively with the newly appointed Internal Controls Councillor, who took up the role in June. Unfortunately, there was insufficient time to meet and finalise the report ahead of the July meeting. Notwithstanding this delay, all monthly bank reconciliations were completed as required.
- **Box 5** – A 'No' response has also been recorded due to a timing issue with the formal approval of the council's Risk Management document. An error identified within the document necessitated amendments, which meant the revised version was presented to the Parish Council in April 2025, rather than March 2025 as originally intended. As a result, formal approval was given in the new financial year. Nonetheless, the council is able to evidence active monitoring and compliance with its risk management procedures throughout the 2024/25 financial year, consistent with the policy's intent and framework.

I acknowledge these matters occurred during the early stages of my appointment as Clerk/RFO. I take full responsibility for these oversights and have implemented steps to ensure similar issues do not arise in future. The errors were noted and discussed by the council at the meeting held on 19th May 2025, recorded under Minute Reference 17264.
